

Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) in Art Education

Admission Requirements:

Applications to the MAT program will be accepted for fall semester. Admission for the MAT in Art Education is contingent upon completion of a BFA in Art or the equivalent. To be eligible for admission to the MAT program, students may be required to complete additional coursework to establish proficiency in the visual arts.

Virginia licensure requirements call for completion of an undergraduate major in art with (minimum) 36 hour course distribution:

- Two-dimensional media: 12 semester hours
- Three-dimensional media: 12 semester hours
- History of art, aesthetics, and criticism: 9 semester hours
- Related areas of art: 3 semester hours

Within this requirement, applicants must have taken courses with content equivalent to AVT 472 (Critical Theory in the Visual Arts) and AVT 180 (Computers in the Creative Arts). Other undergraduate courses that must be taken include courses with content equivalent to 5 pre-professional courses offered at George Mason University:

AVT 396 Introduction to Art Teaching and Learning
AVT 493 Teaching Visual Thinking Through Media, PK-12
AVT 494 Teaching Critical Response to Art, PK-12
EDUC 301 Educationally Diverse Populations
EDUC 302 Human Growth and Development

Admission to the MAT program will require a minimum 3.0 cumulative undergraduate GPA. Candidates for the MAT program will be selected by a department committee. Meeting minimum criteria does not guarantee admittance to the program.

Each applicant must provide the following materials by **January 15th for fall admission:**

1. Completed application form
2. Certified copies of all undergraduate transcripts and any graduate transcripts.
3. Three recommendations from faculty members or individuals who have firsthand knowledge of the applicant's academic or professional capabilities.
4. A statement of purpose for entering the field.
5. Resume
6. Portfolio CD showing breadth and depth of studio skills, including drawings
7. Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), if required as per Mason policies.

All materials listed above will be sent to the University Office of Admissions. Qualified applicants will be notified for an on-campus interview, portfolio review, and writing sample. Bring proof of passing scores on Praxis I or SAT equivalent.
